General Scholarship

IUPUI International Experience Scholarships: This award is intended to support IUPUI students in an approved study abroad program. The award consists of a \$1,000-3,000 gift, depending on program length. Candidates must be degree seeking at IUPUI and participating in an approved overseas program in which they will earn credit towards an IUPUI degree. Non degree-seeking students who are completing a certificate may also be considered on a case-by-case basis. You do not need to be accepted into a program before applying for the scholarship. International Enhancement Grants

To help students pursue academic training which adds or enhances an international component of their graduate degree program. Training activities supported include: enrollment in a foreign language or an area studies course not offered at IU; participation in a structured international internship or a formal training program or workshop on an international topic. Wallace International Scholarship Fund

IU School of Social Work: The scholarship will be given to students enrolled in the School who wish to participate in the IUSSW International Concentration Placement Program or do independent study abroad, but lack sufficient funds to do so. Scholarship funds may be used for tuition, books, travel and transportation, and living expenses while abroad. The recipient will be selected on the recommendation of the Director of Field Instruction to the Dean of the IU School of Social Work. The number, amount, and recipients of the scholarship will be determined by the Scholarship Committee of the School. Scholarships are granted periodically. School of Nursing

The School of Nursing provides up to \$1,200 in scholarship support for undergraduate and graduate students participating in course work occurring abroad. Through the Charlotte A. Carley/Jean E. Schweer Mentorship in Cross-Cultural Studies Fund and the International Learning Experience Program Fund, students may be awarded support for course expenses. Criteria for selection include GPA, an essay on learning goals and relevance of course to program outcomes, and strong letters of support. For more information, contact the School of Nursing.

Confucius China Studies Joint Research Ph.D. Fellowship

The Confucius China Studies Program (CCSP) Fellowship offers generous funding to students in doctoral programs at U.S. institutions who are pursuing China-related research across a broad range of fields in the arts, education, humanities and social

sciences. Successful applicants will be supported for a period of at least six months to up to two years as they pursue research at one of 15 designated universities in China.

Includes: An annual living stipend (80,000 RMB, approximately 12,900 USD), host university tuition, reimbursement for the cost of roundtrip, insurance coverage, pre-departure orientation at IIE's headquarters in New York, an annual research stipend (20,000 RMB, approximately 3,200 USD), and airfare coverage for a research visit to China by the recipient's home university advisor.

To be eligible for this award, applicants must meet the following criteria: Be enrolled in a doctoral program at a U.S. institution (a terminal master's program does not meet this requirement); be pursuing China-related research in the arts, education, humanities, or social sciences; have an HSK score of at least level 3; not be a citizen of the People's Republic of China; and will not have extensive experience in China prior to graduate school enrollment (i.e., will not have been enrolled as a degree-seeking high school or undergraduate student in the PRC).

External Grants through IU

U.S. Department of State Fulbright Grants (IIE)

Fund periods of study or research abroad (6 months to an academic year). Award consists of travel, tuition, books, maintenance, and health insurance. In order to be eligible, you must be a U.S. citizen; demonstrate language competency sufficient to carry out an individual program of study or research; be a graduating senior or graduate student from any discipline, department or campus. Applications are reviewed and rated at IU before submission to the Fulbright program.

Fulbright-Hays Grants for Doctoral Dissertation Research Abroad

Support area studies & modern foreign language research in non-Western European countries. Award consists of travel, monthly maintenance, dependant allowances, research allowances, and health insurance. In order to be eligible, you must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident; demonstrate sufficient language proficiency; be entered into doctoral candidacy at an IU campus prior to the beginning of the grant. **DEADLINE:** March

Rhodes, Marshall, Churchill and Mitchell Scholarships

Students interested in the Rhodes, Marshall, Churchill, and Mitchell Scholarships will have to be nominated by Indiana University and have to submit an application to the nominating committee. The IU committee strongly encourages students who are interested in any of these scholarships to begin working on their applications and talking with potential referees as soon as possible. The application should include:

- A 750-word statement discussing your most important activities, interests and honors in college; your proposed course of study.
- A 500-word statement on the student's reasons for studying in the UK and/or Ireland
- A 500-word statement on the student's proposed academic program
- A list of your activities and honors while in college, including prizes, scholarships, offices held, and extracurricular interests
- Two letters of recommendation that comment on your work and accomplishments sent directly by the recommenders to either Trevor R. Brown, Dean, School of Journalism, Ernie Pyle 200 F, IUB, 855-9249, brownt@indiana.edu or Edda Callahan, OVPIA, Bryan Hall 104, 855-5021, egcallah@indiana.edu.

DEADLINE: Mid-September. Interviews held within a week of the application deadline.

Support for two years graduate study at Oxford University, Great Britain, with third year possible. Geared towards students of proven intellectual achievement, integrity, leadership, energy, and concern for others, who are in their senior year or beyond and 18-23 years of age on October 1 of year applying. 32 scholarships awarded each year. Support for one to three years of graduate study at almost any university in the United Kingdom. Geared toward students who have distinguished academic records, strong aspirations for graduate study and who are in their senior year or within two years after graduation; no age limit. Up to 40 scholarships awarded each year; a limited number may be awarded to students who seek to do a 1-year degree only. Website:

Support for one year of graduate study in engineering, math, or science at Churchill College, Cambridge University, Great Britain. Geared toward students of exceptional ability who are in their senior year or beyond and 19-26 years of age. 13 scholarships awarded each year. Website:

Mitchell Scholarship

This scholarship, sponsored by The US-Ireland Alliance, was named in honor of former Senator George J. Mitchell. Support for one academic year of postgraduate study at institutions of higher learning in Ireland, including the seven universities in the Republic of Ireland and the two universities in Northern Ireland. Prospective scholars must have a demonstrated record of intellectual distinction, leadership, and extracurricular activity, as well as personal characteristics of honesty, integrity, fairness, and unselfish service to others that indicate a potential for future leadership and contribution to society. All fields of study are considered that these universities offer and for which students are prepared. For students in their senior year who will have completed an undergraduate degree no later than the summer before they enter an Irish university and who are 18-30 years of age. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.7 (not required, but recommended). Additionally, nominees must submit: an endorsement by the nominating institution; an on-line application; a personal essay of no more than 1000 words specifying the proposed course of study in Ireland, field of interest and justification for the proposed study in Ireland; a statement of achievement/activities; one photocopy of the nominee's birth certificate, passport, or documented evidence of U.S. citizenship (a driver's license is NOT a citizenship document); ten passport-size photos with the nominee's signature on the back of each photo; ten copies of the nominee's college transcript (one must be a certified transcript); and five to eight recommendation letters submitted on-line by professors or other persons familiar with the nominee's academic progress or employment. 12 scholarships awarded each year. EPA Marshall Scholarships

Students nominated by Indiana University and then selected in national competition for a Marshall Scholarship may wish to apply for an EPA Marshall Scholarship. Jointly funded by the Marshall Commission and the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), these Scholarships will support research specifically in the area of the environment and can be in any related field. Applicants may study at any appropriate UK Institution. To be eligible for the EPA Marshall Scholarship, applicants must first be selected as Marshall Scholars, applying in the usual way, and must be pursuing a graduate degree in one of the following areas:

- Physical, life, or systematic sciences
- Engineering and technology
- Economics
- Social and behavioral sciences
- Urban and regional planning
- Communication science

The proposed program of study must be demonstrably relevant to environmental protection, restoration or stewardship; environmental public health; or ecosystem health. Applicants whose work emphasizes the study of global environmental problems, international collaborative approaches to

environmental problem solving, technology exchange programs or research to improve international dialog regarding the environment will be given first consideration.

The Marshall Commission will pay for the first two years of the Scholarship and the Scholar will spend this time in the UK. The EPA will pay for up to three additional years of study, which can be spent in the UK or the US, providing this research culminates in a doctoral degree. More information is available at:
