Summer Chinese Language Instruction

Confucius Institute at IUPUI and World Languages and Cultures offer Chinese language instruction in Guangzhou, China.



APPROXIMATE DATES

- mid May to mid June, 2010

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- Students will take Chinese language courses at Sun Yat-Sen University. During the first three weeks, students will have classes at Sun Yat-Sen University. During this time, students will participate in cultural activities, attend lectures on Chinese history and culture, meet local students for an exchange of ideas, attend folkloric performances, and participate in visits of the city including trips to local museums.
- During the fourth week, students will travel to Beijing and will visit the Great Wall, the Forbidden City, and other significant sites in the Beijing area.
- Students with no previous Chinese language course credit can receive three credits in C117 and one credit in WLAC-F 100. Students who have already taken C117 can receive three credits in C118 and one credit in WLAC-F 100. Students who have already received credit in C118, C119, or C201 will receive four credits in the next subsequent course. Students will receive transfer credit from Sun Yat-Sen University.

ELIGIBILITY

- Degree seeking students attending Indiana University, Purdue University, or one of the Consortium of Urban Institutions in Indianapolis (Butler University, Franklin College, Marian College, University of Indianapolis and Martin University).
- Student must have completed at least two semesters of college completed.
- Student must have an overall GPA of at least 2.75.
- This program is also open to IUPUI faculty and staff members.

Complete eligibility criteria and selection criteria are outlined within the Academic Policies and Procedures of the Office of Study Abroad. Selection is based on maturity, seriousness of purpose, and appropriateness of match between program and applicant. Students on academic or disciplinary probation during program period are not eligible. Students must be at least 18 years old to participate on an IUPUI Study Abroad Program.

HOUSING

- Students are housed in university dormitories for international students located on campus.

- Airfare: \$1,400 (estimated costs, final cost won't be known until tickets are actually purchased)
- Tour to Beijing & Excursion: \$550
- Tuition & Registration: \$470
- Dorm fee: \$276*
- Textbooks and teaching materials: \$34
- Health Insurance: \$26
- Program Administrative Fee: \$430
- OVST-Y496 fee: \$108
- **Total estimated expenses: \$3294***
- (Additional costs: food and personal expenses)
 - *\$276 Dorm fee is for a double room. The dorm fee for single room will be \$477.
 - *Costs will vary depending on the current exchange rate, price of plane ticket, and individual expenditures.

- Scholarships of up to \$2000 may be available to students through the Confucius Institute for participation in this program.
